Key Statistics and Facts

- Healthcare workers are five times more likely to sustain a workplace violence injury than other professions.
- In 2021-2022, the healthcare industry accounted for a rate of 14 nonfatal injuries involving days away from work per 10,000 full-time equivalents (FTEs), more than triple the overall rate for all industries combined (4.3 per 10,000 FTEs).
- The COVID-19 pandemic has significantly increased workplace violence incidents in healthcare settings due to heightened stress, anxiety, and staffing issues.
- Healthcare workers have a 20% higher chance of being the victim of workplace violence compared to other workers.
- According to the American Nurses
 Association, 1 out of 4 nurses are assaulted
 on the job.
- Healthcare workers account for 73% of all nonfatal workplace injuries and illnesses due to violence.
